Students learn effective ways to design interventions to reverse maladaptive emotional and behavioral patterns, and quickly begin to master new, practical clinical skills that can profoundly impact work with clients by promoting a collaborative, self-defining approach to growth. ACAP's methods for working in challenging situations can make the difference between burnout and career satisfaction through covering basic concepts in modern psychoanalysis. Participants receive a certificate of completion at the end of each course.

ACAP111 Maturational Process: Early Developmental Failures

Tuesdays 7:10-8:55pm Meets six dates: September 5, 12, 19, 26 and October 3, 10

This course will cover the developmental failures which begin at birth and result in fixations and regressions during the psychosexual stages of life. ACAP112 Analytic Listening

Tuesdays 7:10-8:55pm Meets six dates: October 24, 31 and November 7, 14, 21, 28

This course introduces students to the unique way that a clinician listens as a psychoanalytic psychotherapist. By allowing clients to introduce topics without interference, the clinician listens to the client's story, mode of communication and the story that is not being told. The untold story is analyzed silently as the unconscious communication is reported in dreams, projections, defense mechanisms, resistances and transference communications. ACAP113 Treatment of Impulse and Obsessive Disorders

Tuesdays 7:10-8:55pm Meets six dates: February 6, 13, 20, 27 and March 6, 13

This course will present a clinical diagnostic category each week at an advanced level. Addictions, obsessive compulsive disorder, intermittent explosive disorder and other disorders of impulse will be presented. The course prepares clinicians to work psychoanalytically with a wide range of presenting symptoms and offers perspectives from other mental health disciplines. The course prepares social workers and other mental health professionals to work psychoanalytically with respect, awareness and techniques that bridge the gap between clinicians and clients who are from diverse backgrounds or stages of life.
