

GOOD STUFF: Generosity, Courage, Gratitude, Forgiveness



This course will be delivered over four 1 hour and 40 minute lecture and Q&A sessions, plus one 1-hour presentation.

The first session will focus on courage, second on generosity, third on gratitude, and the fourth on forgiveness. In each of these sessions, developmental origins of the respective capacities as well as their psychopathologic variants will be discussed. Illustrative vignettes from daily life, culture, and clinical work will be presented in all sessions. While developmental and psychopathological concerns will be raised, the emphasis will remain upon the application of these insights to conducting psychotherapy and psychoanalysis.

Saturday evening Keynote & Dinner 6:00 - 8:00pm "The Immigrant Experience – as an immigrant clinician and as an immigrant patient"

This 1-hour session will describe Dr. Akhtar's personal journey as an immigrant from India, and its impact on the course of his work and life. It will highlight the types of resilient functioning needed to navigate this cultural and emotional transition, as well as the challenges. Dr. Akhtar talk is about the ways adapting to new cultures can impact identity, self-esteem, motivation, and relationships. He describes some countertransferential issues therapists may have in working with immigrant populations, and strategies to help these clients benefit most from the therapeutic relationship.

Salman Akhtar, MD, is a Professor of Psychiatry at Jefferson Medical College, and Training and Supervising Analyst at the Psychoanalytic Center of Philadelphia. He has served on the Editorial Boards of the International Journal of Psychoanalysis, Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association, and Psychoanalytic Quarterly. He is currently the Book Review Editor of the International Journal of Applied Psychoanalytic Studies. His nearly 300 scientific publications include 16 solo-authored books,.Dr. Akhtar is, most recently, the recipient of the prestigious Sigourney Award (2013).
